


SYMPHONY SQUARE


Symphony Square is a flexible events and office space that includes three newly-renovated buildings and a 350-capacity outdoor amphitheater. It is also home to the Waller Creek Conservancy. The complex is conveniently located in downtown Austin along Waller Creek, near the Texas Capitol, and in the heart of the Red River Cultural District.



THE PAVILION

CAPACITY: 65


A 2,698 square foot interior meeting or event space. The Pavilion comes equipped with full audio/visual capabilities for indoor/outdoor use, as well as the ability to be synced with The New Orleans Club. The event space includes a wooden bar, prep kitchen, and four restroom fixtures. Please note, this space is only available Monday-Friday after 5PM and Saturday and Sundays from 7AM-11PM.



THE NEW ORLEANS CLUB

CAPACITY: 35


A 1,076 square foot meeting or event space that includes full indoor audio/visual capabilities. The event space also includes a wooden bar, two restrooms, and a small event storage room.



THE AMPHITHEATER

CAPACITY: 350

A 350-capacity amphitheater with Waller Creek as its centerpiece, Symphony Square makes a picturesque setting for a show. Opened in 1978, it remains the city's only venue where performers take the stage by footbridge. While the stage does not include fixed audio/visual kits, licensees are welcome to bring in audio/visual production equipment for their events. The Amphitheater does not include restrooms so it must be used in conjunction with one of the other available event spaces.
